

Fortinet logs network security reports

SECURITY VENDOR FORTINET HAS extended its Fortilog security reporting systems range and entered into a partnership to add a new tool to its portfolio.

The firm has claimed the new version of Fortilog will enable the channel to help customers deal with multi-vendor security networks. The new version has an improved graphical user interface

and more than 60 new reports and queries to give administrators detailed intelligence on network and security activity, the firm told *CRN*. It currently has more than 400 different reporting options.

Fortinet has partnered with eIQnetworks to enable it to add FortiReporter Security Analyser (FSA) to its product range. The software, which uses a browser interface to report on geographically distant network security

devices, is based on eIQnetworks' firewall analyser product. It can report on more than 30 types of network security products.

"The time required to develop our own version of FSA meant it made sense to go for eIQnetworks' solution," said Richard Cassidy, systems manager at Fortinet UK. "People aren't going for unified solutions but best of breed, so having a device to monitor multi-vendor networks is

key. They need to be controlled in a format people understand."

The new software is being released to partners immediately.

Greg Carlow, managing director of VAR Repton, said: "This is a logical extension. We've mainly been successful with Fortinet in medium-sized companies with a wide geographical distribution."
